After much planning, design, and redesign, NHS/AVS is pleased to be opening its second technology home, which is expected to be occupied early in the New Year. The custom built residence, located in Kennedy Township, Allegheny County, will be called "home" by four gentlemen. The location is fully accessible, accommodating the mobility needs of the men who all utilize wheelchairs. The home includes many of the features that have been successful in our first technology home including kitchen cabinets, sinks, and a cook top that move up and down, remote controlled window blinds and lighting, and more. New features in the second home will include Smart Tint window technology, accommodations to enhance independence in the bathrooms, and a virtual reality system.



The technologies that have been chosen for the home are aimed at enhancing independence which teaches new skills and helps individuals to reach goals and live everyday lives. We look forward to sharing stories about life in the new home through our website and social media.
